(5) Citizen Request – Issuance of temporary Certificate of Occupancy to O'Reilly's due to delays from Brookshire Municipal Water District. (Mr. Aaron Creswell)

Aaron Creswell said he has communicated with Brookshire Municipal Water District since November. He said that through email by different forms of communication, Brookshire Municipal Water District notified that they needed approved final drawings of the building's water tap and sewer station in February. On March 1, 2023, the drawings were given to Brookshire Municipal Water District, and it would be 30 days approval process. We have finally received approval for the sewer main and water tap, which has delayed the opening for business. So, the business is requesting a temporary Certificate of Occupancy.

Justin Pruitt (City Attorney) stated that the mayor of the council can issue waivers because right now until everything is finished, essentially, the Certificate of Occupancy that's what's required, but you can do a temporary Certificate of Occupancy and put conditions on the Certificate of Occupancy of 30 days can then come back to the council to see what the status of the project and renew it at that time. Just so it's clear about what we need to do moving forward.

Still, most important, the dedications like street right-of-way and public utility easements, and those things are recorded documents. The plat document is different from a survey. The state law allows you to wavier those requirements if you feel that benefits the city or in a case that doesn't apply. Old Town Brookshire has a plat registered long ago, and many of those property owners have never subsequently plotted anything. So, nothing changed; lots look all the same.
